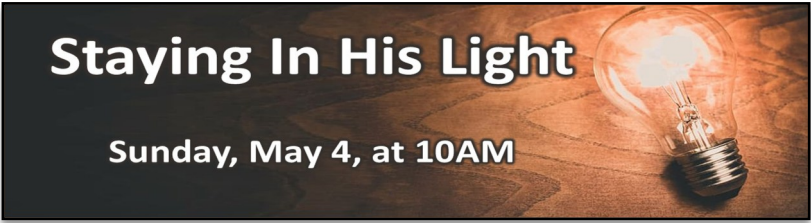
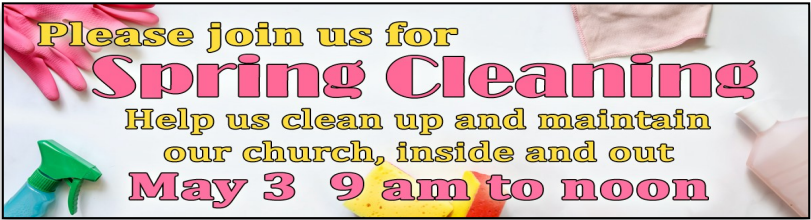


MEN'S BREAKFAST—SAT., APRIL 26 @ 8:30 AM

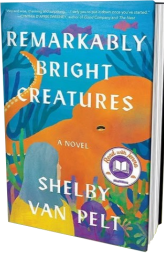
